Submitted by Technique Queen Jan Tinklenberg, this easy easy technique looks just like a milk paint wood grain background!



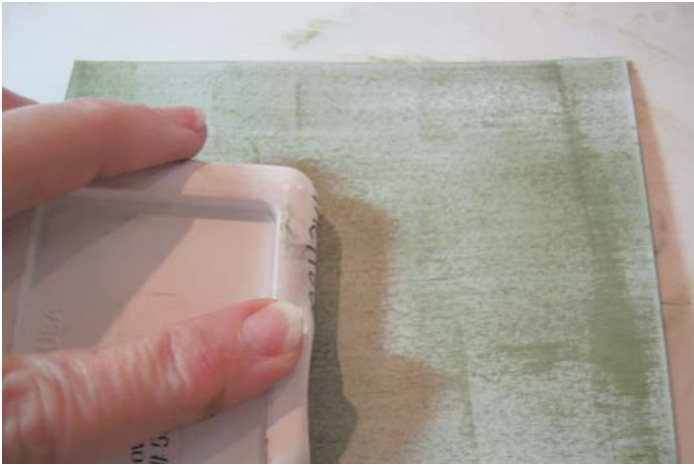
Supplies:

- Medium Color Cardstock
- White or Vanilla Ink
- Ink to match cardstock
- Ruler
- Black marker



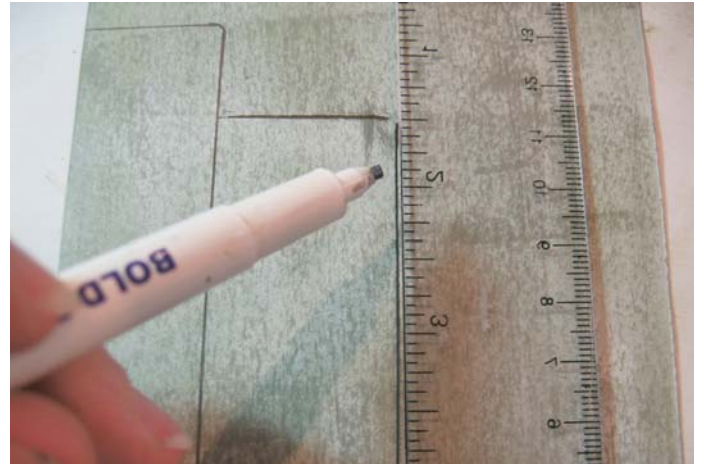
Step One:

Swipe white ink pad over face of cardstock. Leave plenty of un-inked space. Allow ink to dry thoroughly (use heat tool to speed drying, if desired).



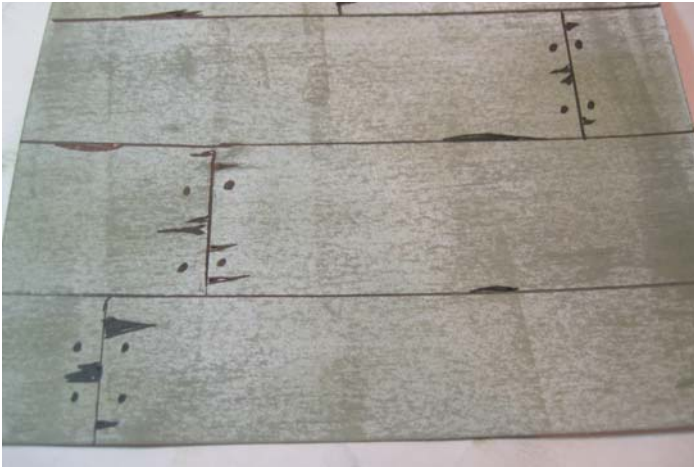
Step Two:

Swipe the colored ink over the white ink, leaving plenty of white, and cardstock, showing. Allow ink to dry.



Step Three:

Use the ruler and marker to create "boards" and "nails" to heighten wood grain effect.



Step Four:

Use as desired.

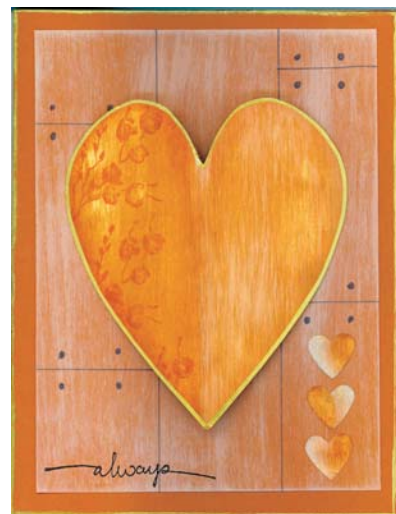
