Washi Herringbone Tutorial The Herringbone technique is one of my all-time favorites -- using Washi tape makes it

easier than ever! Filmed by Pat Huntoon.

Finished Card:

Artist: Pat Huntoon Stamps: Technique Junkies Stamps



Supplies:

- 4 or more Coordinating Washi Tapes
- Cardstock, Card front size
- Scissors



Step One:

Using the darkest, or most dominant, Washi Tape, adhere a strip across the cardstock, from the top left corner down to the bottom right corner.



Step Three:

Using the same tape, adhere a second piece of tape on the cardstock at a 90 degree angle to the first, from the lower left corner up to the edge of the first tape. Do not overlap.



Step Five:

Using a second color of tape, adhere a piece adjacent to the first tape in the upper triangle. Do not overlap the tapes.



Step Two:

Use the scissors to square off the end of the tape that is still on the roll. Do this after every piece of tape is put on the piece.



Step Four:

Adhere a third piece of the same tape at a 90 degree angle to the first, near the top right corner to the edge of the tape. Fold tape edges under the cardstock. There are now 4 distinct triangles of cardstock remaining.



Step Six:

Using the second tape, place a piece next to the first tape on the other side of the triangle at a 90 degree angle to the first piece of the same color.



Step Seven:

Adhere a third color of tape adjacent to the second.



Step Nine:

To finish the triangle, add another color of tape (or another set of tapes, if necessary).



Step Eleven:

Fill in the remaining triangles, varying the tapes with each addition.



Step Eight:

Adhere the third color to the piece, adjacent to the second, at a 90 degree angle to the first.



Step Ten:

Move onto another triangle (the one of the right, in the picture above), starting the triangle with a different color of tape than was used initially in Step Five.



Step Twelve:

Tuck and/or cut off excess tape. Use background as desired.



Note:

To make handling the tape easier, I cut off strips and hung them off my table edge.




