Sew me a Title Tutorial

Supplies

Script title stamp OR
Script title from computer font
Paper piercer
Fun foam or cutting mat
Needle
Embroidery floss (6-stranded)

Regular tape or photo tabs
Temporary or removeable
adhesive
Cardstock
Scrap paper large enough
for title

Steps Three & Four

Place cardstock on foam/mat.

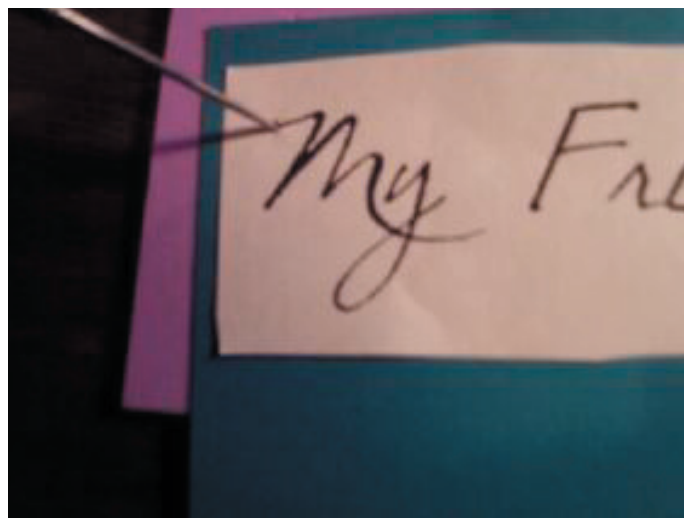
Using paper piercer, poke holes through the scrap paper
AND cardstock, spacing holes evenly, following the lines
of the script title.



Steps One & Two

Stamp script title on scrap paper, or if using a computer font,
print onto scrap paper.

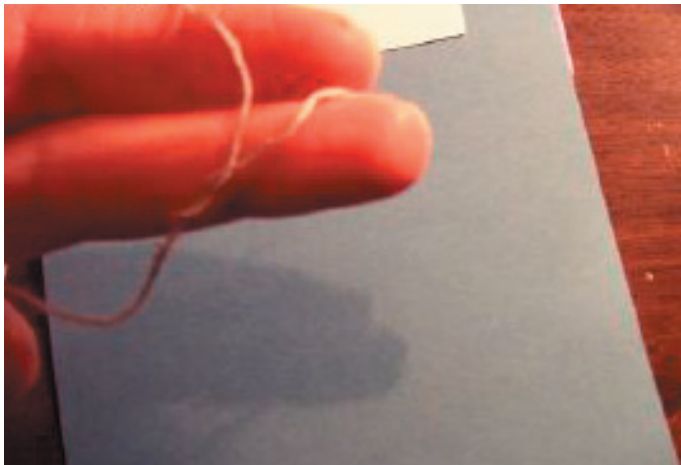
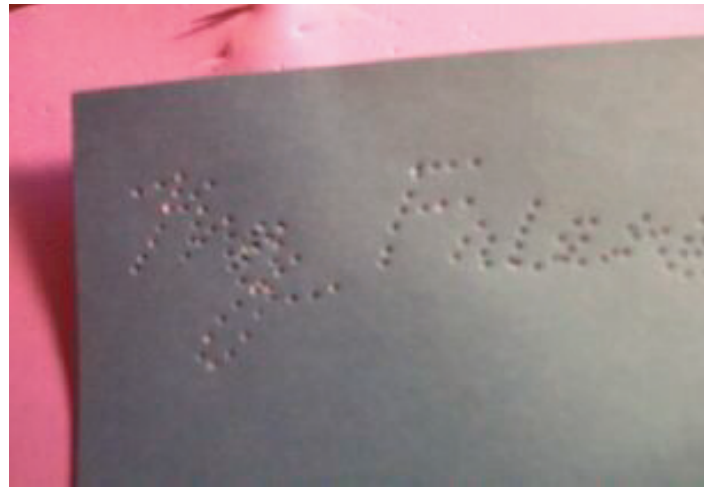
Attach scrap paper with title face-up on right side of cardstock
using temporary adhesive.





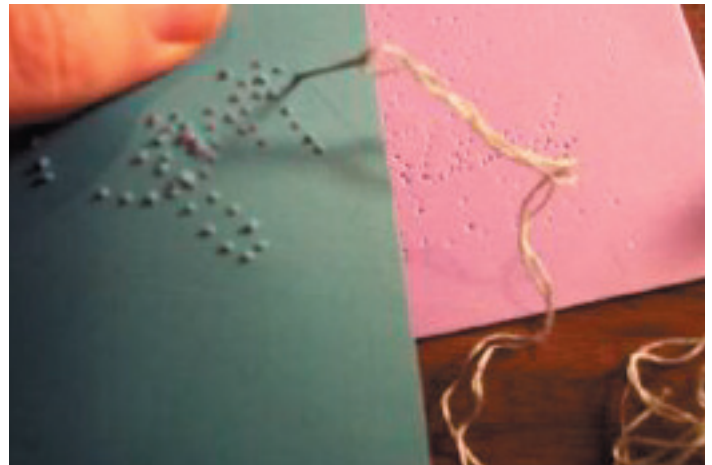
Step Five

Remove scrap paper from cardstock.



Steps Six, Seven & Eight

Cut a 24" piece of embroidery floss.
Separate the floss into two sections of three strands.
Thread needle with one group of strands.



Step Nine

Starting from the back of the first hole, thread needle through the hole, leaving 1" of floss on the back.



Step Ten

Place photo split or tape over 1" piece on back.
Do not cover up any holes!



Step Eleven

Sew needle from top through second hole.

Steps Twelve Through Thirteen

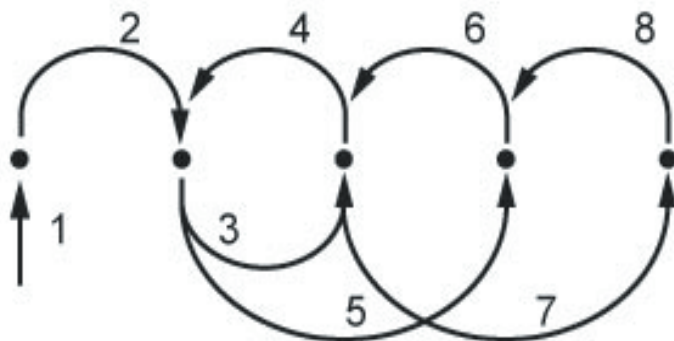
Sew needle from bottom through 3rd hole.

Sew needle from top through second hole. This is a simple backstitch, and gives you the look of a continuous line.
(See illustration)

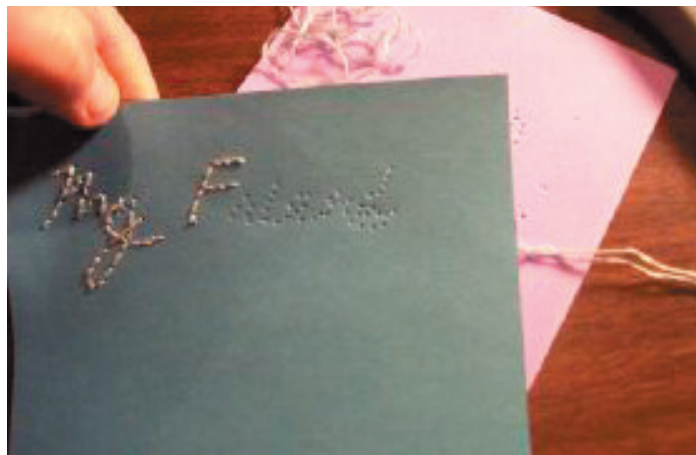
Sew from bottom through 4th hole.

Sew from top through 5th hole.

Continue on with backstitch until title is finished.

Steps Seventeen Through Nineteen

you run out of thread before completing the design, or if your thread gets knotted, stop your stick on the back and cover with a photo tab. Then just thread the needle with a new piece of floss and attach end with a tab to the back, continuing your stitch where you left off.

When complete, trim floss to 1" at back and tape down.

If making a card, make sure to mat this piece to hide the taped pieces.

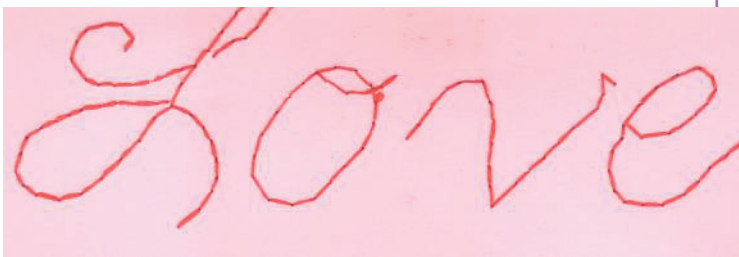
