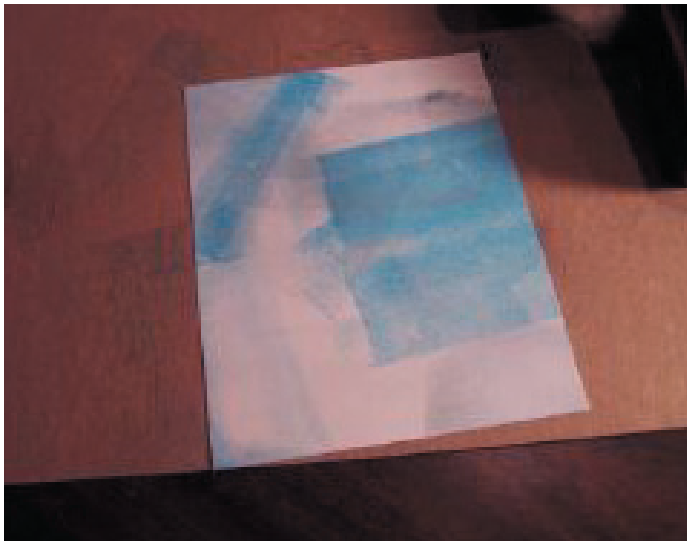
Supplies

Brayer
Heat gun
4 color-coordinating ink pads,
from light to dark
White embossing powder
Black embossing powder
White cardstock
Talcum powder
1 image stamp
Background or abstract stamp
Clear embossing ink



Step One

Brayer layers of color onto the cardstock, using two different colors and overlapping the inks. The cardstock should show both colors of ink, but there should also be white space showing.



Steps Two & Three

Rub talcum powder over the ink.
Shake off excess talcum powder.



Step Four

Stamp bold image and background image one or two times randomly using clear embossing ink.



Step Five

Emboss with white embossing powder. .



Step Six

Ink Brayer & cover the remainder of the cardstock with the two remaining colors. Overlap the so that all of the 4 brayered colors show on the card.





Step Seven

Using the same image and background stamps, use your darkest color ink(s) and stamp the images randomly.



Steps Eight & Nine

Rub talcum powder over the ink.
Shake off excess talcum powder.

Step Ten

Stamp greeting with embossable ink and emboss in black.

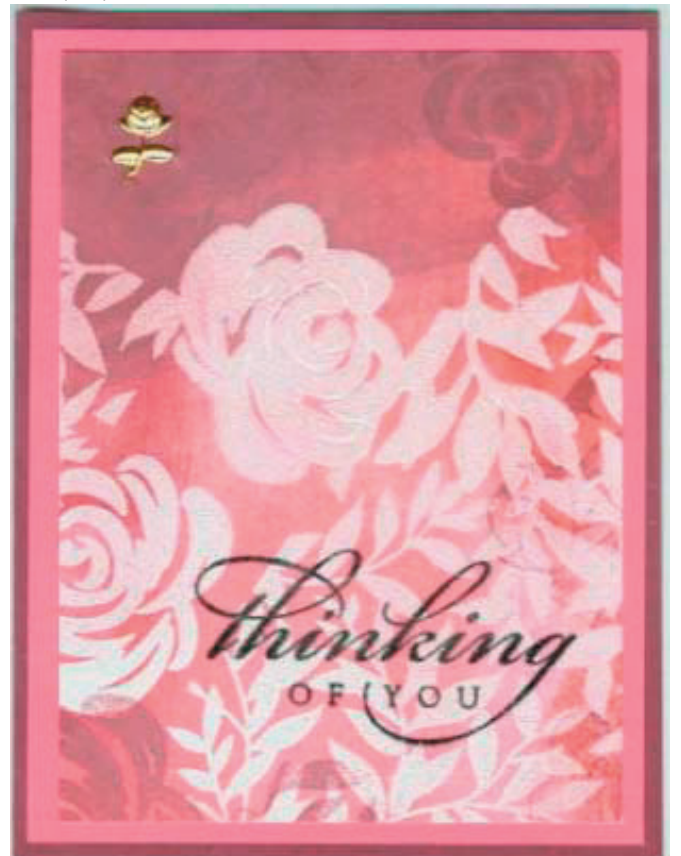
