

Layered Portions Tutorial

This is a quick and easy way to use three stamps for a multi-dimensional look. We use just a portion of the background stamp, leaving white space for the eye to rest.

Finished Card:

Supplies:

- Light-Colored Cardstock
- Light, Medium and Dark Inks
- Background Stamp
- Bold Image Stamps
- Sentiment Stamp



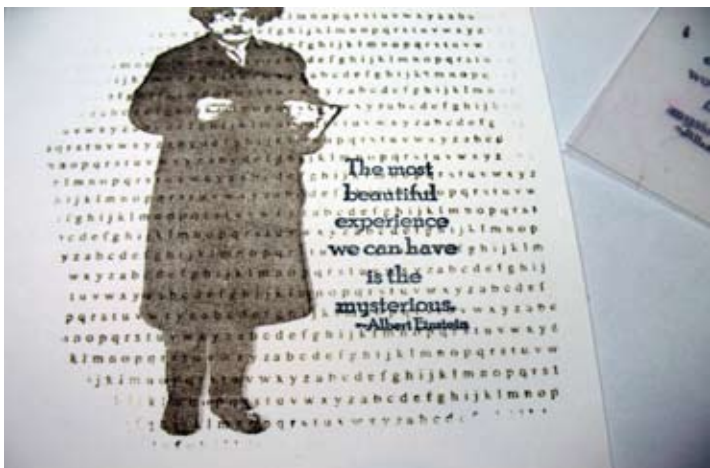
Step One:

Place the background stamp on the work surface face-up. Rub the lightest ink over $\frac{2}{3}$ of the stamp, making sure the inked area is larger than the bold image.



Step Two:

Stamp the background on the cardstock, with the majority of the image on the right side of the paper.



Step Four:

Ink the sentiment with the darkest ink and stamp over the background, to the right of the main image.

Step Three:

Ink the bold image with the medium ink and stamp over the background, centering this image on the cardstock.



Step Five:

Mat and finish as desired.
