

## Punched Border Stand-Up Card Tutorial

*This is an easy and pretty 3D card. It folds flat to mail.*

### Finished Card:



### Supplies:

- 4 1/2" x 11" Cardstock
- Scoring Tool
- Border Punch
- Ruler
- Matting Cardstock, Images, Ink and Embellishments
- Slit Punch



## Step One:

Place the vanilla cardstock in the scoring tool and score at 4 ½", 5", 5 ½" 6" and 6 ½".



## Step Two:

Fold the cardstock on the scores as Mountain, Mountain, Valley, Mountain, Mountain.



## Step Four:

Border punch the opposite side.


## Step Three:

Use the border punch to punch along the 11" side from the edge of the cardstock up to the score line. Use the marks on the punch to ensure a perfect punched edge.



## Step Five:

Trim off any excess paper.



### Step Six:

Repeat on the other side of the cardstock.



### Step Seven:


Larger punches cut deeper into the cardstock. The area between these punches is  $1 \frac{7}{8}$ ".



### Step Nine:


Use the slit punch to create a slit at the top of the back (not matted side) of the base. Place the slit in the center of the cardstock,  $\frac{3}{8}$ " or so from the top.

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### Step Six:

Use the ruler to determine the dimensions of the area of the cardstock between the punched borders (every punch cuts into cardstock at different depths). The area in this example is 3" x 4", which will be the size of my largest mat.



### Step Eight:

Create mats based on the measurements in Step Six. Adhere to one side of the base piece.



### Step Ten:

To stand card up, slide the top piece into the slit. Finish as desired.
