

Scalloped Envelope Basket Filmed by Chris Dickinson

Finished Card:

Artist: Chris Dickinson Stamps: I Brake For Stamps; Stampin' Up!



Supplies:

- 4 pieces of 4 ½" x 5 ½" Patterned Paper or Cardstock
- 3 1/8" x 3 1/8" Card stock (for base)
- 2 pieces of 1 ¾" x 7 ¾" Coordinating Patterned Paper or Cardstock
- 12"-14" Ribbon (depending on length of handle desired)
- 2 Jumbo Eyelets
- Crop-A-Dile
- Red Tacky Tape/ Adhesive
- Scalloped Envelope BIGZ die or Similar-Die
- Big Shot or other Die Cutting Machine
- Stamps, Sponge Daubers, Ink, Embellishments
- Additional Cardstock to Stamp On



Step One:

Using the 4 ½" x 5 ½" patterned paper or cardstock, cut 4 envelopes using the Big Shot and Scalloped Envelope Die. Optional: If desired, sponge along all scored lines.





Step Two:

Cut off the side flaps on two of the envelopes.



Step Three:

Place adhesive on the side flaps and adhere envelopes together to form an open box.



Step Four:

Place the 3 1/8" x 3 1/8" on the inside of the box. Place adhesive on the bottom flaps and adhere to the square base.



Step Five:

Place adhesive on the 2- 1 $\frac{3}{4}$ " x 7 $\frac{3}{4}$ " patterned papers. Adhere to the box just below the scallop flap score line.

Step Seven:

Use the Crop-A-Dile to punch a hole on 2 opposite sides. Insert Jumbo Brads and set.

Step Six:

Place adhesive on the scalloped flaps and adhere to the sides of the box.



Step Eight:

Insert the ribbon through the eyelet and secure with either linen thread by tying a knot or inserting a brad. Stamp and embellish as desired and fill with treats for giving.
