

## Tie Dye Circles Tutorial

These circles can be large or small depending on the overall look you are trying to achieve. Filmed by Beth Norman.

Finished Card:
Artist: Beth Norman Stamps: Technique Junkies Stamps


## Supplies:

- Watercolor Paper
- Paint Brush with Water or Aqua Painter
- Sponges
- Three Colors of Ink, light to dark



## Step One:

Sponge the lightest color of ink onto the cardstock in a circular motion, creating several large circles.


## Step Three:

Sponge a tiny area of the darkest color of ink in the center of the inking.


## Step Five:

Repeat Step Four with the center color.


## Step Two:

Sponge the second color inside the light shade, again using a circular motion, leaving an edge of the first color.


## Step Four:

Use the paintbrush or Aqua Painter to add water to each circle, starting in the center of each inked area. Use a circular motion, picking up the ink with the brush, allowing the ink to move. Rinse off brush and repeat until the color lightens.


## Step Six:

Repeat Step Four with the outer color. It does not matter if the color does not go right to the end. Any sponged area that is left alone looks like bleeding of the tye die. Use as desired.
