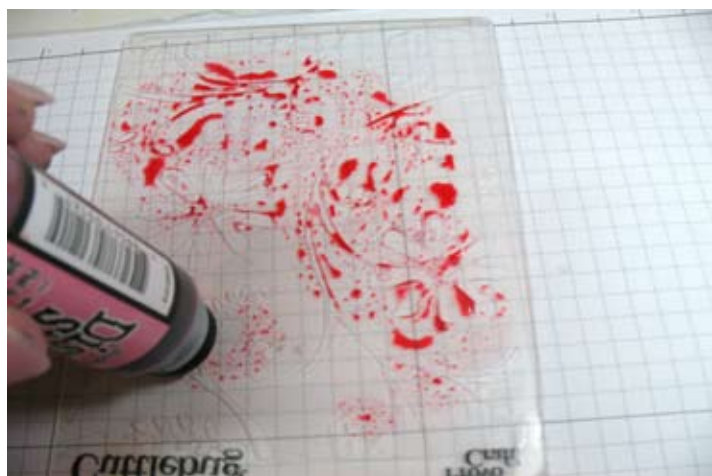
Pressed Stains Tutorial

This is the easiest way to add colorful designs to any background. Filmed by Pat Huntoon



Supplies:

- 4 ¼" x 5 ½" Cardstock
- Embossing Folder
- 3 Complementary colors of Distress Stains
- Water filled Mist Bottle



Step One:

Open the embossing folder and apply one of the stain colors directly to some areas on the inside of the embossing folder. Leave plenty of unstained space.



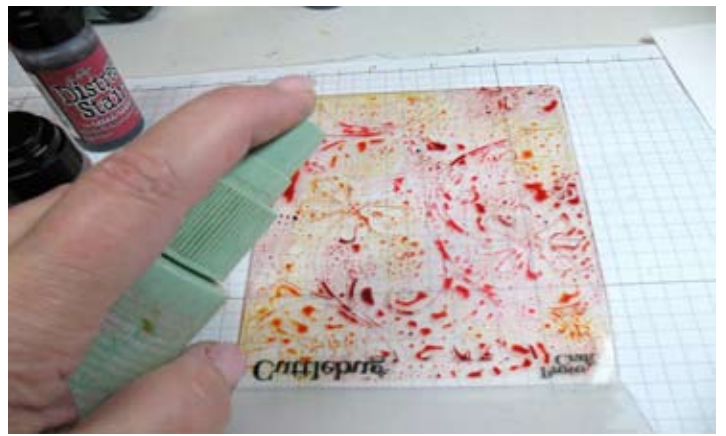
Step Two:

Add the second color to the folder, covering more of the unstained space. Leave a small amount of space uncolored.



Step Three:

Add the third color to the rest of the folder.



Step Four:

Mist the stains with water.



Step Five:

Place the cardstock inside the folder and press down firmly to transfer ink from the folder to the cardstock.



Step Six:

Allow the piece to dry and use as desired.
