Finished Card:

Supplies:

- Bleach
- Several Distress Inks
- Container to hold Bleach
- Blending Tool with a Clean Pad
- White or Cream Cardstock

Step One:

Using wet ink pads, apply them direct to the paper to get a good wet coat of ink on the paper.



Step Three:

Pour a small amount of bleach into the container. Dab the blending tool in it. Do not use too much bleach or it will drip all over the cardstock. Press the blending tool to the paper and lift to create a block. Repeat in a pattern or apply the blocks randomly. Note: The circular blending tool works just as well as the rectangular one.



Step Two:

The papers can be covered with one color, or several depending on your preference.



Step Four:

Allow the bleach to air dry or use a heat tool. Use as desired.




