Supplies:


- Gesso—the thick kind, not the liquid kind
- Stencil
- Watercolor Paper
- Water in Spritzer
- Watercolor Crayons
- Plastic junk mail credit card
- Craft Mat


Step One:

Place the stencil over the watercolor paper. Dab a bit of gesso on the craft mat and pick some up with the credit card.



Step Three:

Remove stencil. Wash immediately. Let card dry.




Step Five:

Color randomly with watercolor crayons filling the area. Use several colors as desired.



Step Two:

Wipe the gesso through the stencil, filling in the stencil with the gesso.



Step Four:


After gesso on card is dry, spritz with water.



Step Six:

Spritz with water until the colors blend. Let dry.
