


Tie It Together Tutorial

Supplies:

- Technique Sheets from TJ Techniques
- White Paint
- Dark Ink
- 2 Paint Brushes
- 4 1/4" x 5 1/2" Adhesive Covered Cardstock (can be regular cardstock run through a Xyron machine)
- Plastic Palette
- Scissors
- Paper Cutter (Not Shown)

Step One:

Choose sheets from previous TJ techniques that are harmonious in color. Cut various thicknesses of strips from the technique papers.



Step Three:

Use scissors or paper cutter to trim technique strips from edges of the cardstock.



Step Five:

Load the brush with white paint and flick or tap to disperse the paint onto the cardstock.



Step Two:

Expose adhesive on cardstock. Lay technique strips on adhesive in random manner.



Step Four:

Place a small dollop of white paint in a palette well with a small amount of water. Thin the consistency so it will splatter easily. Drop several drops of ink into another well.



Step Six:

Load the brush with dark ink and flick or tap to disperse the ink onto the cardstock.


